<b>Seniors</b>	<p><i>AP Literature:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>All the Pretty Horses</b> by Cormac McCarthy</li> <li>Read one self-selected novel. You may want to select a novel or drama from <a href="#">this list</a> or select a novel or drama of similar literary merit. Suggestion texts include <i>East of Eden</i>, <i>The Old Man and the Sea</i>, <i>Catcher in the Rye</i>, <i>A Thousand Splendid Suns</i>, <i>To Kill a Mockingbird</i>, <i>The Grapes of Wrath</i>.</li> </ol> <p><i>TWU and English IV:</i></p> <p>Choose a good book to read. Look at the lists above or choose any book that you will read and be interested in. Choose one fiction and one non-fiction read.
