On March 16, 2020 Coppell ISD suspended in person instruction due to the COVID- 19 Pandemic. Our fourth and final marking period was done completely virtually was recorded as Pass/Fail grading. Students Marking Period 3 grade was duplicated as the semester 2 for conclusion of the 19-20 school year. As of August 1st, 2020 Coppell ISD will be virtual until September 8th, 2020. Following the 8th students will choose between virtual or face to face instruction. Students are able to change their status every 9 week grading period if they would like.

Pass Average: Students who fail a semester of a year-long class receive credit for that semester if their average in the course for the year is 70 or above.

Standardized Test Scores

Standardized test scores are not recorded on the Coppell High School transcript. Students are instructed to report test results directly to colleges through the College Board and ACT.

Rank

Coppell High School ranks only the top 10%. Students in the top 10% have a certificate of rank attached to their transcript. The GPA used to compute rank is a core GPA while the transcript GPA includes all courses.

GPA

All classes are included in the GPA on the transcript. A weighted 4.0 scale GPA and a weighted 5.0 scale GPA are listed on all transcripts.

College Acceptances

In 2020, 73% of CHS graduates entered four-year colleges and universities with 20% of those attending out of state schools. 13% entered two-year schools. Here is a partial list of the 527 institutions accepting CHS graduates the past three years.
