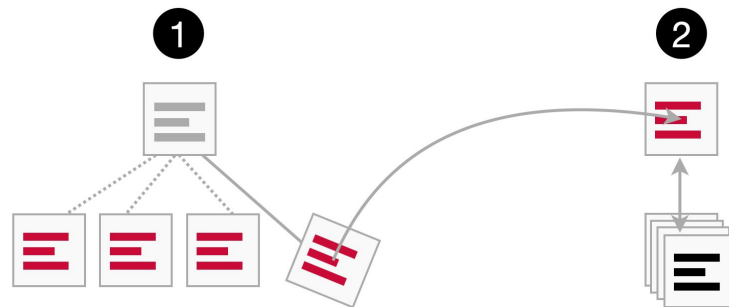

How to use these cards

1. Place the **grey Key card** in the center of the table. Arrange **the four crimson Value cards** underneath them. Respond to the prompt from the **Key card** as a group to select the appropriate **Value card(s)**.
2. Shuffle the **black Advocacy cards** and reveal one at random. Go around the room and respond to any of the prompts in relationship to the earlier selected **Value card(s)**. Reveal as many **Advocacy cards** as desired or as time allows.
