- II. Roll Call - Introduction of Committee members
- III. Open Forum/Public Comments
 - A. None received.
 - B. Angela Brown reviewed emergency communication protocol with Committee members.
- IV. Senate Bill 11 Update – Stop the Bleed presentation - **Joyce Alcorn**

- A. In 2017-2018, the CISD nurses started the Stop the Bleed program and were trained by Parkland Hospital. In 2019-2020, a legislative update mandated that school districts add Stop the Bleed supplies and training for certain employees and students.
- B. CISD has 63 AEDs in the District, and all except for the mobile athletic devices, also contain bleeding control kits.

V. Signage at campuses- **Rachael Freeman**

- A. Several campuses had requested assistance with signage to help with preventing unauthorized visitors on their campus grounds during school hours and/or school use (i.e. playground areas, track).
- B. Committee members discussed why the signs would be helpful, verbiage to use on the signs, possible sign size, and mounting locations.

VI. Intruder Assessment discussion points & considerations – **Rachael Freeman**

- A. Rachael discussed intruder assessments drills conducted over the course of three days in January & February. The emphasis of the drills was on exterior security coupled with the barriers and layers of security.
- B. The CHS9 campus shared their drill outcome and corrective actions taken.

VII. Security coverage at CMS West, Lee, Canyon Ranch, and Valley Ranch – **Dr. Dennis Womack**

- A. Dr. Womack reviewed the primary purpose for having security personnel on campuses as a component to the District's safety and security plan.
- B. Current security personnel campus coverage was shared with the committee members along with an alternative means to provide the same level of service to the CISD campuses located in the City of Dallas and City of Irving. Committee members provided comments and feedback on the possible alternative option.

VIII. Adjournment & next meeting dates

- A) Campuses were asked to schedule Spring Safety Team meetings, submit documentation for MAT drills, submit Sentinel of Safety nominations, and review the District's EOP in May.
- B) Next meeting is scheduled for June 2, 2022, at 4 pm currently via Zoom, but hopefully will move to in-person.
